Learning Centre - 1



Bhatti Khurd

How to reach

- This centre is on the Chattarpur Sanjay colony (Bhatti Mines) road. One has to drive down for almost 8 kms towards Sanjay colony. On the way one the left side one will come across Daffodil restaurant and banquet garden, and Radha Swami Beas Ashram (a religious congregation).
- The landmark: Adjoining to the Radha Swami Ashram, there is Sawan Public School. Take right turn from the Sawan Public School to the road going to the village. Drive for half a kilometer and then take the road going down. This takes you to Bhatti Khurd village. Now ask for the Panch Ghar (community centre) inside the village.



Mrs. Krishna

Krishna is 35 years old and is a proud mother of 2 sons. She is 12th class pass and has also done diploma course in cutting and tailoring from the polytechnic. She has been with Concern for Humanity from past 5 years and during this period she applied for the job as an Anganwari worker (Kindergarten) and she was selected. Now, in the mornings she runs the centre (Kindergarten) for infants and toddlers and later in the second half she runs the Learning centre. She is a dedicated worker and we are fortunate to have her with us.

About the children





- Number of children : 31 (23 Girls and 8 Boys)
- All children are school going children who are studying in class I – V in the nearby primary school.

Learning Centre - 2



Bhatti Kala

How to reach

Bhatti Kala is the adjoining village to Bhatti Khurd. And the learning centre is located in the community centre of Bhatti Kala village.



Ms. Nisha

Nisha is an 19 years old girl. She belongs to Bhatti Kala village. She has studied up to 9th class and is among the few literate girls of the village. She is very shy and belongs to a conservative family where girls do not move around. And probably this was the reason that initially her parents were not ready for allowing her to work with Concern for Humanity. Thanks to Krishna, she convinced Nisha's parents and trained Nisha under her own guidence. And finally Nisha was given free and full chargeship of the centre.

Nisha always smiles and this is the secret as to why children love coming to her centre. She is a hard working girl and Concern for Humanity is fortunate to have her.

About the children





- There are a total of 31 children enrolled at this centre. Of which, 21 are girls and 10 are boys.
- This centre has a mix of both in-school children and school drop out girls.

Learning Centre - 3

Fatehpur Dera

How to reach

On the Chattarpur – Sanjay colony (Bhatti Mines) road, before the Radha Swami Ashram, there is a right turn and this is called Fatehpur-Dera. One has to drive for almost 1.5 kms. And then take a left turn. After half kilometer there is a right turn (it's a narrow road), and then from the T point, take the left turn. The centre falls on the right hand side.



Mrs. Prabha

Prabha is a young married woman aged 23 years of age and has studied up to 10th class. Like Krishna, she also runs an Anganwari centre (Kindergarten) in the morning in Fatehpur Dera and later during the day she runs the Learning centre for children. She is creative but shy and is very good at keeping children engaged in activities. She is into the family way and is expecting her first baby, so at times she finds it difficult to come and attend the weekly teachers' meeting which is held at the coordination office.

About the children





- There are a total of 30 children enrolled at her centre, of which 21 are girls and 9 boys.
- All are school going children.

Learning centre - 4



Sambhav Camp

How to reach

Sambhav camp is a slum area which has around 500 families living in there. It is slightly on the other route. There are two ways to reach this centre. The easier way is to take the Mehrauli Chattarpur – Gurgaon road (popularly known as MG road). And after crossing Chattarpur, on the left side will come Sultanpur. Take that road and go straight for almost 8 kms and the Sambhav camp will fall on the left hand side. There is a bus stand close to the slum's main entry. From there go straight for half a kilometer and the centre is running in a rented accommodation.



Ms.Priyanka

Priyanka is small but power packed girl. She is 20 years old and is 12th class pass. She lives in Sambhav camp. She speaks good English and is often seen teaching English to children at the centre. Prior to joining us, she used take tuition classes and her this experience is coming very handy and strongly contributing towards strengthening children's learning capacity.

About the children





- There are a total of 33 children enrolled at her centre, of which 23 are girls and 10 boys.
- This centre has a mix of in-school and school drop-out children.
